#### Pam Hansen – Trustee Update

- The provincial budget is slated to be released around February 27 (about a month earlier than expected)
- Currently, there is a ward review being done. As it stands, residents of Wolf Creek Public Schools are represented by six trustees on the Board of Trustees. Each trustee represents a ward within the boundaries of the school division (5 wards in all)
- A few parents have sent in letters to our MLA regarding current and future funding inadequacies in our school
- Wolf Creek Public Schools has postponed its student exchange trip to China, scheduled for March 2020, due to the current coronavirus outbreak

#### 1. Calendar of Events

## 2. High School Programming

- Stephen Lush spoke regarding various High School program options being offered to Bentley students.
- A few programming options our students may get the opportunity to explore include Animal Sciences at Olds College, a Hospitality and Tourism course, Agriculture and Trades (March 20), Horticulture and Land Environment (April 3) and a career open house at RDC.
- Another option for students is SWAC: School Within a College. This program is run in coordination with the Red Deer College and is intended to support students in obtaining a high school diploma. This particular program is geared at exposing students to post-secondary opportunities.

## 3. Curling Academy

 The Bentley School has been approached about the possibility of starting up a Curling Academy next year. It would look very similar to our Hockey Academy program. This is something that administrators are currently looking into.

## 4. Class Size Configurations for Next Year

- Trying to determine the best class configurations is very much a balancing act. And with anticipated funding cuts, split classes and/or afternoon split classes are both potential options that administration will be considering.

• At the Elementary level, one option that is being considered is having separate classes for the core subjects of Language Arts and Math in the morning, then bringing students together in the afternoon for a split class structure. Due to the fact that Wolf Creek Public Schools in virtually out of reserve money and with the impending cuts made throughout the province to education, we are having to look at creative ways to configure our classes for the upcoming school year.
