



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Parent Panther Poll Summary

Bentley School Council would like to extend a big thank you to all the parent's that filled out last month's Parent Panter Poll. Your feedback was valuable as it has provided insight and will help guide our school council moving forward. One of our goals this year is to increase the voice of our parent community and increase awareness of our school council.

Based on the recent Parent Panther Poll we were able to gather the following information:

- 1. There were 44 participants in this month's Parent Panther survey of approximately 240 families that attend Bentley School.
- Communication: The survey indicated that the best route for information sharing is preferred to be through school messages and emails, school newsletter and social media pages.
- 3. Parent Engagement/Volunteer: The survey indicated that parents would be willing to support our school by helping with beautification projects, fundraising and running special events. With current restrictions parent volunteer opportunities have been very limited and we are trying to find creative ways to provide that opportunity for parents to be involved in their children's school experience.
- 4. Parent Learning Opportunities: The survey indicated that anxiety in children, safe media, pandemic stress, and raising teens were most common topics of interest for learning. We will be looking at ways in which we can advocate for these needs through our school and the community.
- 5. Feedback was also collected on what parents would like to see as a mission or vision for our school council, topics of discussion for our meetings to help increase parent engagement and activities that would increase involvement with our Jr/Sr High parents.
