Bentley School is a small rural school in the beautiful Blindman Valley and is home to roughly 438 students from K-12 and another 26 in PreK.

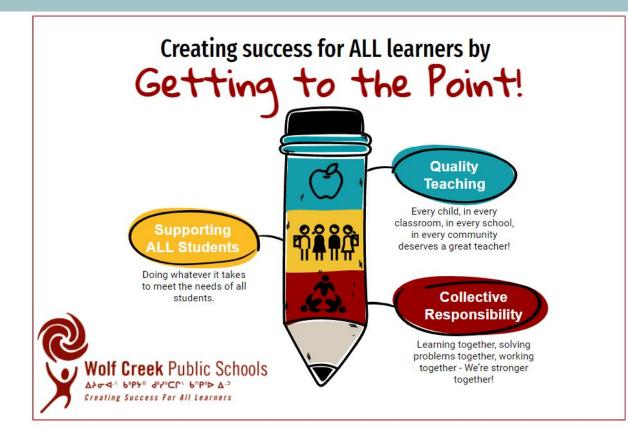

In 2022-2023, the Board allocated \$193,256 toward the district's School Nutrition Grant. Schools have an opportunity to request funds to provide a sustainable and universal feeding program. Each school has the autonomy to deliver a program that meets the needs of their students and school setting. To provide a sustainable model, schools can allocate up to 0.2 FTE for a support staff person to manage the program. The Coordinator of Safety and Wellness updates the Board throughout the year on the school's programs.

Successes

- Close to 400 hot dogs for students every month through our hot lunch program
- 168 pieces of toast every morning for students as part of the breakfast program.
- Daily snack bins are set out each morning; vegetables, cheese sticks, yogurt tubes, etc.
- Weekly healthy snack made for Gr. K-8; pizza bites, frozen granola bites, pancake bits, cheerio bars, etc.



Student Level Breakdown Spring 2022 - 2023 (250) for All Schools, All Grades, All Rooms








(School Survey) Percentage of parents believe there are appropriate supports and services available to meir child(ren) to help with learning.








