Swim to Survive Lessons

A recent Lifesaving Society study found that almost all Canadians (98%) agree that swimming is a life skill that every child should learn. Yet another study revealed that a surprising 60% of Canadian children don't take swimming lessons. Bentley School is excited to offer this opportunity to our Kindergarten to Grade 6 students. Permission forms and the \$40 fee are online and must be completed prior to participating in the program along. Watch for paper copy of the information required by the pool coming home as well. All forms are mandatory. Swim to Survive meets the majority of students needs:

- Swim to Survive has the flexibility to meet a wide range of student skill and interest levels.
 - Weak and non-swimmers focus on developing Swim to Survive skills.
 Core survival skills are presented in a manner that interests both swimmers and non-swimmers.
 - Stronger swimmers focus on participating in challenge items that engage their interest and teach them new skills.
- Students respond well to "swimming is not just about learning strokes". They willingly working on basic skills (i.e. kicking, sculling) especially when presented in a style that promotes fun (friendly competition, cooperative games, fitness). The stronger their skill level, the more interested they are in challenge items (i.e. entries, synchro, water polo, underwater swims).
- The use of buoyant supports such as lifejackets and AquaJoggers succeed in putting students on an even playing field. Having the additional floatation support allow weaker swimmers to participate equally with their peers. No one misses out on group activities based on their limited skill levels.
- The standard for successful performance is within reach of all students.

Registration for 2024-2025 Open for Pre-K and Kindergarten

New student registration for Pre-K & Kindergarten to Gr. 12 opened January 8. If you currently have a student in Pre-K who is either Kindergarten age or returning to Pre-K, parents will receive an email with returning student registration instructions. Current, Kindergarten to Grade 11 students won't receive returning student instructions until August 2024.

Pre-Kindergarten New Student Registration for 2024-2025

- Returning Pre-Kindergarten students will receive an email with registration instructions.
- New students must select the 2024-2025 NEW BFPA Registration Form
- Children must be 3 or 4 years of age by December 31 of the upcoming school year in order to apply
- Programs are designed for children to attend two days per week on a Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday. Four days per week programming may be available following further consultation with families and is based on location and availability.
- A copy of the original birth certificate and other legal documentation (custody orders, etc.) must accompany your registration. If you need to order your child's birth certificate, click on the link to Alberta Services.
- Pre-Kindergarten students are not eligible for busing.

Kindergarten New Student Registration for 2024-2025

- Programs are designed for children to attend two full days per week. Days offered will depend on the number of students registered. Please register by March 31 to help with program planning.
- Kindergarten class placements are based on a number of factors including, number of kindergarten registrations received, date of registration, program day availability and student needs, not just on parent preference.
- A copy of the original birth certificate and other legal documentation (custody orders, etc.) must accompany your registration. If you need to order your child's birth certificate, click on the link to <u>Alberta Health Services</u>.
- Rural Kindergarten students are eligible to apply for busing.

When are buses cancelled and schools closed due to Inclement Weather?

In Wolf Creek Public Schools, Administrative Procedure 132 (AP 132) guides decisions for school closure, due to inclement weather. The Division takes precautions with respect to the welfare of students and staff coming to or going from school. When road or weather conditions jeopardize the safety of students and staff, schools will be closed and bus runs cancelled.

How is the decision made to cancel buses and close schools?

- 1. Temperature in excess of -40 degrees Celsius with or without the windchill.
- Dangerous road conditions and/or poor visibility (e.g. heavy snowfall, blowing snow, freezing rain, heavy fog).

When is the decision made to cancel buses and close schools?



The Transportation Manager and Superintendent make the decision after appropriate information is gathered from each of the school areas.

This decision will typically be made prior to 6:00 am but may be made earlier if clear and compelling information is available from Environment Canada.



Communicating to families & staff

Communications to parents/guardians and staff are sent out via email, text and phone call when the decision is made to cancel buses and close schools.

Notices will also be posted on the Division website, on radio stations and on Wolf Creek's Social Media Channels (Facebook & Twitter). PLEASE ENSURE you are monitoring those social media channels and your email whenever inclement weather is expected, occuring or in the forecast.

Why are schools closed when buses are cancelled?

- Given we are a rural school division we know that when buses don't run it often means the majority of students will not be in school. Staff then are unable to cover any new material with students.
- If buses aren't running and schools are open some families feel compelled to get their children to school. This can at times promote people to take risks that could be avoided.



- · WCPS staff still attend their school sites, unless deemed unsafe to do so.
- If schools remained open for students, and road conditions are poor, it can lead to logistical issues when some staff aren't able to be in the building at the usual time in the morning.

Snapchat is a photo sharing app for mobile phones and tablets. The app allows users to share images for a limited number of seconds, chat with users before messages disappear, and share images with their friends list through a 'story'.









What parents need to know about **SNAPCHAT**

SNAP MAP

In 2017, Snapchat introduced a new feature called 'Snap Map', which allows users to see the EXACT location of the people on their friends list in real-time and watch stories from around the world. Users can view a map called a 'Snap Map'. This feature completely exposes your child's location and users can potentially follow your child from their home to their school.

'SNAP STREAKS' Streaks' tell users how many days in a row they have spoken or sent'snaps' to one another. What's dangerous about this? It forces young people into putting a false sense of importance on a superficial number to the extent that it becomes something that can make or break a friendship. For example,

If a person forgets to message or send a picture to their friend, breaking their 200-day streak, this could cause a confrontation between the friends.

This can put an incredible amount of pressure on children to keep streaks.



SCREENSHOTS

While Snapchat's gimmick is that all photos, videos and text disappear after a maximum of 10 seconds, users can still screenshot or save them. Users may sometimes forget that screenshotting is a possibility in the app and send an image to someone they trust.

THINK BEFORE YOU SNAP Ensure that your child knows that 'Snaps' can be screenshotted and teach them that if they post anything potentially embarrassing or harmful (either of themselves or someone else) it can have severe consequences, as if the message lasted forever.

EDUCATE ABOUT RISKS OF SEXTING

It can be slightly awkward talking about this topic with your child, but if it helps them protect themselves, then it is worth it. Talk to them about the consequences of sexting and make sure that they're aware of the risks prior to using Snapchat.

RESTRICT WHO CAN VIEW THEIR STORY

Your child can add videos and images to their 'Story' throughout the day which last for 24 hours. By default, anyone in their friends list can see their story. We recommend that children only have their close friends and family on the app.

ENTER'GHOST' MODE ON SNAP MAPS

We highly recommend enabling Ghost Mode on the app so that your child's location will no longer be visible to anyone on the 'Snap Map'. To enable this, go onto the Snap Map and tap the cog in the topright corner. Here, change your settings to 'Ghost Mode'.

DISAPPEARING ILLEGAL CONTENT

Snapchat 'deletes by default' which means every opened snap image or video is automatically deleted. If your child has seen criminal activity on Snapchat, you should report it immediately - See 'Reporting Inappropriate Content' above.

TURN OFF 'QUICK ADD'

for arents

'Quick add' helps friends find each other on the app. This is based on mutual friends or if their number is in their phone book. Explain to your child that this feature can open up their profile to strangers. We highly recommend that your child turns off the 'Quick Add' feature.

REPORTING INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

If your child is receiving inappropriate content, it's important that you report it. First block the sender to prevent any further messages. You can then report this by sending an email to safety@snapchat. com. If the problem persists, contact CEOP at ceop.gov/report.

THINK BEFORE YOU SNAP

Ensure that your child knows that 'Snaps' can be screenshotted and teach them that if they post anything potentially embarrassing or harmful (either of themselves or someone else) it can have severe consequences, as if the message lasted forever.

HOW TO DEACTIVATE SNAPCHAT

If your child wanted to delete their Snapchat account, simply deleting the app from their phone is not enough. To deactivate the account, users will have to log in to their account on desktop or on their mobile device (not through the app). Here, you: 1) Go to support.snapchat.com/delete-account

 Go to support.snapchat.com/delete-account
 Here, click on 'Delete my account'
 You will then be asked to enter your username and password again

What Is Connect?

Connect is a 10-week program to support parents of pre-teens and teens with difficult behavioural and emotional struggles, such as anger, aggression, depression, conflict with parents and teachers, and getting into trouble with friends.

Each session provides parents with a new perspective on parent-teen relationships and adolescent development. Parents watch roleplays, engage in conversations, and learn new choices for responding to their teen's difficult behaviour.
