

Registration for Returning Students

Every family (new and returning) will receive an email in regards to a returning student profile update for the 2024-2025 school year. We require parents to follow the instructions on the email and submit the information asap. Once this online process is completed, the information is then updated into your child's demographic within PowerSchool. It is important that schools have correct and current phone numbers, contacts, addresses, etc. If you did not receive an email asking you to update your child's student profile, please check your spam/junk folder. The returning student registration information forms must be completed online by **September 13, 2024**. Parents are required to log into their PowerSchool Parent Portal, click on the School Engage tab and complete the online student demographic form. If you are having issues submitting the form or have any questions, please contact Bentley School at 403-748-3770. These forms are mandatory for parents to complete every year.

At Bentley School, we love our volunteers! We need help with track meets, picture days, popcorn days and in the classrooms. All volunteers are required to complete: <u>Volunteer Application Form</u> - Must be completed yearly

Criminal Record Declaration Form - Valid for 3 years

<u>Vulnerable Sector Check Application</u> - Valid for 3 years and is only required if the volunteer will be working closely with children in situations where he/she will be alone with individual children and groups of children, without direct supervision and oversight from staff; and In a natural position of trust and authority given the relationship between children and school volunteers. These forms will be kept on file at the school.

Life is Worth Living Presentation

Life is Worth Living speaking engagements are dedicated towards spreading awareness and decreasing the stigma surrounding mental illness and suicide for students in Gr. 8 - 12. After Jaclyn and Callie lost their older sister, Brianne, to suicide when she was only 19, they began to share their story in hopes of preventing other families from losing a loved one to suicide.

These twin sisters believe each and every one of us have a story that relates to mental health or suicide and it is time we are able to speak openly about them. They began sharing their story at the age of 15 and have been speaking publicly for almost 13 years. Brianne showed them how to be brave and how important their voices are. These two sisters hope through Life is Worth Living that they can show you the same.

Callie and Jaclyn share the story of losing their sister to suicide and how it has impacted them and their family. Together, they educate their audience on recognizing warning signs of suicide and how to help connect someone who is feeling suicidal with the proper resources. To close off, they end on a positive note by focusing on the importance of managing your mental health and self-love.

BrightArrow Communications

To enhance communication between our school and parents, Wolf Creek School Division is now using the BrightArrow telephone, email, text, and social media message communication system that enables school personnel to notify all households and parents by telephone, email, text within minutes of an emergency or unplanned event. It also may be used periodically to communicate general announcements or reminders from your child's school or division.

The first three contacts listed on a student profile that indicates they have custody or the child lives with them will receive text messages, emails and phone calls from the school and/or division office, starting Sept 3. These contacts are opted in for text messages, email and to receive phone messages. If a contact wants to opt out of receiving one or all of these messages, they follow the instructions on the bottom of the text message, email or phone message.

DISCLAIMER: Please note that if you opt out of communication, you may miss important messages from the school in regards to athletics, school closures, and other important matters!

Busing Reminders

School Zones Reminder

When you approach a school sign, with a maximum speed posted with it, you are entering a school zone. You must NOT exceed the posted speed when the zone is in effect. Times (school days only) are:

- 8:00 am to 9:30 am
- 11:30 am to 1:30 pm
- 3:00 pm to 4:30 pm

These hours may vary for different towns/cities according to municipal bylaws. If a municipality does establish times different from these, the times will be posted beneath the school sign. You are NOT PERMITTED to pass or attempt to pass another vehicle traveling in the same direction within a school zone, when the school zone speed limits are in effect. The **speed limit** for both urban and rural school zones is **30 km/h** unless otherwise posted.

Bus Status App

All families & students are encouraged to download and install the free Bus Status app. Once installed, users can subscribe to any bus routes that they wish to receive updates on. There will be an update to the Bus Status app in late September, users will be prompted to update their app. Anyone relying on the Bus Status app is asked to refresh their subscription list on the app so they are notified of any changes in bus status for the buses that affect them.

Parents and students will have to download the new app (Bus Status 4) and choose their preferences in the app. After September 29, bus statuses will no longer appear in the Bus Status 3 app.

Bentley School's Code of Conduct

All students and of Wolf Creek schools are required to sign their agreement to the Wolf Creek Public Schools Code of Conduct yearly as part of their returning student demographic update form.

Wolf Creek Public Schools requires all schools attend to their School Codes of conduct as per Section 33 of the Education Act which stipulates that the student Code of Conduct be made publicly available and be reviewed every year by all staff, students and parents.

The Code of Conduct provides all stakeholders the specifics about how each of our Wolf Creek schools are focusing on being welcoming, caring, respectful and safe learning environments.

It outlines what is **acceptable behavior** and what is **unacceptable behavior**. The Code of Conduct also provides information about the consequences of unacceptable behavior, which takes into account the students age, maturity and individual circumstances.

The Code of Conduct also explains what support is to be provided for students who are impacted by inappropriate behavior as well as for students who engage in inappropriate behavior.

Dear Parents,

RE: Fair Notice

The safety of our children is a top priority for us all. We, as a school system, have been involved in intensive safety training and collaboration with our community partners – the police, Alberta Health Services (Addictions & Mental Health) and Children's Services. Together we have created and signed a community protocol for responding to all situations in which students may be posing a threat to themselves or others.

This letter is to inform you that we, as a school system, adopted a policy in January 2003 that mandates schools to have a "zero tolerance" stance for not investigating all threats and threatening behaviours (Admin Procedure 167). The purpose of the investigation/assessment is to determine how best to support high-risk students so that their behaviour does not become harmful or destructive. Please be assured that if your principal is aware of threatening behaviour, he/she will be taking measures to deal with the situation in a positive and proactive manner. If your principal invites you to a meeting to discuss safety concerns about your own child, please be assured that protocol is being followed and that the goal is safety, not punishment.

This letter is intended to serve our community with **fair notice** that we, as a school community, will not accept "no response" to a threat making behaviour. Our goal is to respond to all threats in a professional manner that provides for a healthy and caring learning environment.

We are proud to be able to provide this level of support to our school communities and are most fortunate to have our community partners at our side.

INDOOR SOCCER REGISTRATION OPENS August 1st, 2024!!! Season information:

- 1. Season runs from end of October to beginning of March.
- 2. Games will be approximately once a week, always Saturdays. Game times will range anywhere from 9am to 6pm, and in some cases, there may be double headers.
- 3. Practices will be held once a week, starting at 6:30pm, at the Bentley Elementary School gym, with U9 practicing 1 hr. and the rest 1.5 hours. The likely schedule will be U9's Monday nights, U13's Tuesday, U15's Wednesday, and U11's Thursday. **Please note, practices will be closed to spectators/siblings.**
- 4. We will be opening up registration for U9 players (2016, 2017's), U11 players (2014, 2015's), U13 players (2012's, 2013's), and U15 players (2010's, 2011's). We will be keeping registrations gender specific for the time being to see what we can create for teams. In cases where we do not have enough to have gender specific teams, we will combine to make a coed team.
- 5. If we do not have enough players to make a team, we will unfortunately just not run a team for that age group. Last year's combining of age groups did not work out that well, and as an association, have decided to stay away from that this year. There may still be the odd exception where we move one or two players up depending on ability.
- 6. Fees will be as follows: U9 \$150, U11 \$225, U13 \$225, U15 \$250.
- 7. We will wait to collect fees until we can determine enough players to make a team. Fees will include all practices and games, as well as a jersey/shirt.

Addiction & Mental Health News

September

Government of Alberta announcement: "To safeguard student mental health and reduce distractions, personal mobile devices will no longer be permitted during class time and access to social media sites will be restricted." Effective September 1, 2024.

Take proactive steps to help your family prepare for the new device-free policy.

- Learn about the new policy and implementation plan in your child's school; and talk with your children to prepare.
- Convey a positive attitude about the change and focus on the benefits.
- Brainstorm ways to communicate during school time when needed and create the habit of planning.

Tips for device-free success:

- Although students may still have access to their phones on their breaks, create the habit of planning each day without text messages or phone call reminders. Plan ahead for pickup times/locations, appointments or other activities. This will instill responsibility and help them develop valuable executive-functioning skills.
- Help your children memorize your phone number and other emergency numbers. If they need to reach you while they are at school, they can call from the school office or ask their teacher for assistance.
- Call the school office if you need to relay a message to your child vs texting or calling their device.

Focus on the benefits of device-free classrooms:

Students learn better without phones. Research shows that when phones:

- are away, test scores increase.
- are present, students who are already struggling, struggle more.

Students have improved mood and mental health without phones. Benefits include:

- Increased self-control and ability to focus.
- Improved ability to self-regulate.
- Reduced symptoms of depression and anxiety.
- More in-person time with friends, peers and mentors helps improve their mood.

Tips to encourage healthy cell phone and device habits:

- Set aside devices during mealtimes and focus on conversations.
- Make common areas where family and friends hang out together, device-free to promote positive interactions.
- Put away your own devices when your children are around and want to interact with you. Give them your full attention – they will appreciate you for it, and you will set a great example.
- Encourage everyone to put their devices away at least an hour before bedtime and keep them out of the bedrooms.
